

## Example MRL issues/solutions registrants face

- 1) Residues resulting from US use pattern exceed EU MRL; exported commodity rejected in EU
  - ✓ Increase EU MRL via IT application (or adoption of new CXL)
- 2) Provisional JP MRL reduced to CXL; grower caught off guard, exported commodity rejected
  - ✓ Provide relevant data to obtain permanent JP MRL
- 3) Uptake of soil residues; minor rotational crop exported but no MRL in place to cover residues; exported commodity rejected
  - Submit residue data, obtain foreign MRL



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## Expected MRL challenges for future

- Likelihood of no EU ITs for A.I.s triggering EC Reg 1107/2009 cut-off criteria
- Continuing proliferation of national MRL lists in developing countries
- Less reliance on CXL standards
- Greater complexity when setting MRLs, e.g. acute as well as chronic dietary exposures; greater emphasis on metabolites, esp common metabolites; cumulative risk assessments?
- Increased monitoring of imported foods
- More NGO activity associated with residues in food
- Residue definitions for GMO vs non-GMO crops



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
