








**Agriculture Across APEC** 




# \$96.4B of U.S. Agricultural Products Exported to APEC in 2018






# \$14.3B of U.S. Specialty Crops Exported to APEC in 2018






# \$80.2B of Agricultural Products from APEC Imported to United States in 2018



A guideline on possible approaches to achieve alignment of international MRLs

APEC Food Safety Cooperation Forum Sub-Committee on Standards and Conformance

July | 2016

- Developed from a series of APEC workshops in 2015 and finalized in 2016.
- Seeks to minimize MRL discrepancies and facilitate trade while continuing to protect human health.
- Describes approaches to achieving alignment of MRLs for pesticides within APEC.



# Challenge: Food trade across the APEC region can be disrupted by MRL non-compliances

#### Goal:

Enable trade and avoid unnecessary rejection of safe food by establishing best practices for MRL compliance and enforcement

#### When/Where:

October 9-10, 2018 in Brisbane, Australia

#### Leadership:

U.S. self-funded project

#### **Participants:**

46 experts from 17 economies and 7 **NGOs** 



#### **Workshop Goals**



Explore relationships between missing and disharmonized MRLs with MRL violations, trade, and other economic and social factors

Examine private sector role in maintaining high levels of MRL compliance





#### **Workshop Outcomes**

The overarching themes from the discussions were that:



MRL non-compliances rarely present an actual food safety concern





Flexible, risk-based approaches to MRL enforcement can support food security, prevent destruction of safe food, and facilitate trade to promote economic prosperity
