

 Helps finance activities to market and promote U.S. agricultural commodities worldwide


Emerging Markets Program (EMP)

 Provides funding for technical assistance activities to promote exports of U.S> agricultural commodities to emerging markets worldwide

Foreign Market Development Program (FMD)

 Provides cooperator organizations with cost-share funding for activities that build international demand for U.S. agricultural commodities

Technical Assistance for Specialty Crops (TASC) Logic Model



Assumptions – Projects will address a phytosanitary or technical trade barrier

Factors (outside of our control) - Internal: Statute, Appropriation, Apportionment, Sequester, Title 31 USC ("Purpose Availability Rule"), Regulations, OGC Guidance, Federal Grant Law, Antideficiency Act Restrictions

External: Foreign Government Actions, Competition, Climate, Shipping
