


The Codex mission



Step 5/8:

Increasingly subsidiary bodies are utilizing a Step 5/8 procedure. This entails texts being submitted for adoption at Step 5 having a recommendation that Steps 6 and 7 be emitted and that the text also be adopted at Step 8. This practice substantially speeds up the adoption process. Justiciability of Codex standards, guidelines and codes of practice

- Are **not** a **substitute** for, or alternative to **national legislation**
- Are voluntary in nature
- Need to be **translated** into national legislation or regulations in order to be enforceable
- Codex Alimentarius recognised by WTO as the relevant standard-setting organization for food safety.




























Food price increases (%) since 14 February 2020.


